James A. Williams deceased, was presented in Court and admitted
to record

John Reynolds
Will

In the name of God amen. I John Reynolds of the County
of Giles and State of Virginia being weak and frail in body but of sound
fearing memory and mind do make this my last will and testament re-
viving all others: that it is my will that all my just debts and demands be
paid as soon as possible after my death as convenient. I give and
bequeath to my loving wife Susanah all the house hold & kitchen furniture
is disposed of as she sees proper and the choice one of 8 hogs of cattle
and one gray mare by the name of Snap and the privilege of living
in the dwelling house during her natural life and all the hogs that
I own and the choice of 8 or 9 hogs of Sheep and all the money then
in my pocket as accounts among other ways. I give her one equal
share of it with my children my Slave Maude as she deposes of my of
it to go to my two daughters
Thirdly: I give and bequeath to the heirs of my son James the use
of lands where my son James now resides
Fourthly: I give my son James up all the notes and debts and so
count that he is in due me
Fifthly: I give and bequeath my eight day wooden clock to my
son Joseph also one gray mare named Betty
Sixthly: I give and bequeath to my Son John Adams & Joseph Reynolds
all my land whereon I now reside and where my son John now
resides and each one is to have where they now live and divide
the land amongst themselves
Lastly: I Announce and appoint my friend George S. Williams
and John Reynolds Executors of this my last will and testament
as witness my hand and seal this 28th day of April 1845

I Francis Mace of the County of Giles and State of Virginia
do hereby make this my last will and testament in manner and form
as following:
1st I give and bequeath all my just debts and funeral expenses to be paid =
2nd I give and bequeath unto my wife Mary all my personal estate
after paying my just debts during her natural life except one of my daugh-
ters should marry during the lifetime of my said wife then and in that
case my desire is that the daughter be marrying should be given a portion
of my property
3rd I desire that my Executor hereafter named sell my tract of land know-
n by the name of the Linbawidge Survey
4th I desire that my son Christian I remain with his Mother on the
place where I now live during the life of my said wife and after her death
I give to him the said tract of land the Gray mare that he now
owns and my plough gear
5th After the death of my wife I give to my son John and my daughters
to be paid and Solly each one dollar
6th The balance of my property together with the proceeds of the Sale
of the tract of land above mentioned after the death of my said
wife is to be equally divided between my daughters Peggy Solly and Mary
and my son William except that William is to have twenty dol-
lars left them each of the three last mentioned daughters
7th I give to my grand son Lewis the young horse now on the place
situated provided he remains with my son Christian until he attains
the age of twenty One year and if he fails to do so then said
horse is to be sold and the proceeds to be divided between my
daughters Peggy Solly and Mary and my son William
My desire is that none of my property be sold except as aforesaid
just debts and lastly I do appoint my friend William H. Burt
Executor of this my last will and testament
