In the name of God amen I Martha Hale of the County of Giles and State of Virginia being low in health but sound in mind and memory thanks be given to God calling unto mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say first I give and bequeath unto my well beloved son William Hale one Negro Girl and her two boys (viz) Char Lewis & Joya also one still and still tub also one bed and its furniture also five head of horses all the cattle except one that is to be hereafter devised and all the hogs also all the farming utensils also all the grain that is now on said place where William Hale lives and also all the household and kitchen furniture also two head of sheep

3^d I also give and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter Phoebe McLaugherty one bed and its furniture and also one cow and a calf

4th I also give and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter Polly Williams daughter of (viz) Morgan and Beulah Williams and Martha Ann Williams and all the Girls if any there should be hereafter one Negro Girl named Isabel the said Isabel is to be hired or put with my daughter Polly Williams to about her at the discretion of my Executors if

hired the money to be put on interest for the benefit of my grand daughters above mentioned also one bed and its furniture
5th And lastly I constitute make and ordain my friend John McLaugherty Jun^r the sole executor of this my last will and testament and do hereby utterly disallow revoke & disanul all and every other forms and testaments legacies and Wills bequests and executors by me in anywise before made will and bequeaths ratified and confirming this and no other to be my last will & testament in Writings whereof I shew unto set my hand and seal this 11th of December 1834 signed sealed and acknowledged in the presence of

Agreesably to an order of the worshipful Court of Giles County made at the Sept term 1835 appointing the undersigned Commissioners to settle with William Chapman Executor of George Chapman deceased we have met the said Executor at Giles Court house this 25th day of February 1837 and beg leave to submit the foregoing as the result of our settlement of said Commissioners would further represent that it will be seen by the above Settlement that we have given the Executor credit for an Execution against George Lowers and Archibald Chapman it being for costs sustained in defending a bill filed in the Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery of Giles County against the said William Chapman as Executor aforesaid which we allow upon this Condition viz that if upon a distribution of the estate there should be the amount of the said credit due the said Lowers and Archibald Chapman if there should not be that amount due we then allow a credit in proportion to the amount due the said George Chapman Lowers and Archibald Chapman gave Commissioners would further report that by a reference to the Settlement made with the said Executor next prior to this it will be seen that \$ 184 98 1/2 Cents was the sum upon which we reported the Executor should be charged interest until paid from which sum subtracted \$ 53 the amount of a credit which we have this day given him and which he claimed at the last Settlement for expenses in transacting business of the estate in the year 1816 leaves \$ 81 98 1/2 Cents the
