of Kent being sick and weak in body, but of sound mind and
and disposing Memory for which I thank God and calling to
mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous
to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased
God to bestow upon me with, I give and bequeath in Manner
following that is to say First I desired that so much of
of my Real Property be sold as will pay all my just
debts and secondly I give and bequeath unto my
well beloved wife Mary Bigg two Cows and
household furniture for her to expere of as she
thinks proper and one maid as long as she
lives and at her death to be long to Dolida Bigg
my grand daughter Thirdly, I give and bequeath
unto my well beloved son Thomas Bigg one
horse and the rest of my property for the
Maintenance of my well beloved wife Mary
Bigg. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and affixed my seal this eighteenth day of
January One thousand eight hundred and twenty two

This Indenture made and entered into the first day of October in the year of our Lord 1826, between William Smith the debtor of the first part, Samuel Park and Guy D. French the trustees of the second part, and David French the executor of the third part. Whereas the said William Smith is jointly indebted to the said David French in the sum of six hundred dollars due by note bearing date on this day payable on the first day of May 1827, with lawful interest from the date as by reference to the note aforesaid will more fully appear, which debt with the legal interest thereon the said William Smith is willing and desirous to demand And this Indenture witnesseth, that for and in consideration of one dollar of lawful money of Virginia to the said William Smith in hand paid by the said Samuel Park and Guy D. French the trustees at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said William Smith hath given granted bargained sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell alien and confirm to the said Samuel Park and Guy D. French trustees then here and assigns forever two Negroes named as follows to wit Jack about 16 years of age, Charles aged about 14 years with the future increase of either of them the only proper use and behoof of the said Samuel Park and Guy D. French then here executors administrators and assigns and the said William Smith for himself his heirs executors and administrators the aforesaid Black and the future increase of the aforesaid Charles against the claim
