 named children eight head of cattle with their increase to be divided among
 them when the youngest of the above named children becomes of
 lawful age and be it understood that the above named cattle is
 the same that have been in the possession of the above named

 his heirs do agree to keep and support the said eight head cattle with
 their increase until his youngest child becomes of lawful age

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to act for itself and then the said Isaac Cole is to devote the said
battles with their increase among his children above named and as

is to enjoy the use and benefit of the milch of the said stock of
battles while in his possession which is in compensation for his

I Edward Hale of Hills County and State of Virginia do make this my last will and testament in manners and form following, to wit

First I desire that my executors collect the monies due me by account or otherwise and pay out of the same all my just debts and funeral expenses, and the surplus to be given to my son Elias Hale to help him in the purchase of a farm if so surplus should not exceed eight hundred dollars.
Second I desire that my wife Martha Hale, have the care of all the negroes during her natural life except my mulattoes and Charin and Vinny which I give to my daughter Polly, also Sarah and Betty two black girls I give to my daughter Phoebe. Also I leave to my beloved wife all my the house hold and kitchen furniture with the exception of a bed and furniture to each of my daughters Polly and Phoebe likewise I leave to my wife the one third part of my plantation whereon I reside which she shall include the dwelling house and orchards which she at her decease go to my son William, whose portion of land shall include all below the following line, Beginning at the creek and running up the water draught at the back of the apple orchard to the mouth of the first hollow on the right hand there up so right hand hollow to the outline of the whole tract the balance of the tract to be equally divided between my sons Isaac and Daniel also the land whereon my son Isaac lives together with all other joining thereto.

not otherwise disposed of, shall be equally divided between Daniel and Daniel with the land here given to my son Isaac and Daniel to be valued by disinterested men, together with the land whereon my son Charles lives, which shall be valued according to the state in which he met it the object of this valuation is to make my son Charles, Isaac and Daniel equal to my sons Thomas and Isaiah to whom I gave eight hundred dollars when they became of full age. Likewise my sons Simeon and Elias are to be made equal to their elder brother. Thus I wish the land whereon Lindsey Davis lives to be sold within twelve months after my decease provided he should not give & pay the sum of two hundred dollars within the 1st twelve months.
Fourth I wish my stock of horses and cattle to be sold immediately after my decease and the amount equally divided among my sons - my crop of tobacco now cured to be sold at the discretion of my executors and the money divided equally as above. Also I wish my executors to sell all the farming utensils they may find unnecessary to carry on the farms assigned in the support of my wife Martha.
Fifth I wish Simeon and Daniel and William each of them to have a bed and furniture also the crop of grain now growing if any should remain after the support necessary to my wife and family to be sold, and the money to be divided among my sons equally.
Sixth I wish my sons and daughters who have not received their cows & calves each of them to take two cows & calves before the cattle are sold as a love directed likewise I wish my wife to have the hogs, sheep, & geese, Waggons & fowls together with the Smith tools during her natural life.
Seventh I desire whatever I have left to my wife and woman at her decease such as negroes, table tools, and farming utensils household and kitchen furniture be divided equally or sold & divided among my sons above named as they may agree among themselves.
