This Indenture made and entered into this 18th day of March
1820 between John Thompson sen^r of the first part and Elizabeth Chambers
Eleanor Cole Pegge Cole Thompson late Catharine Cole and daughter
late children of Isaac and Margaret Cole of the second part and
Isaac Cole of the third part witnesseth that the said John —
Thompson sen^r for the natural affection that he bears the above
named Elizabeth Eleanor Pegge Thompson Catharine and daughter his
grand children have this day given and by these presents so convey to the above
named children eight head of cattle with their increase to be divided among
them when the youngest of the above named children becomes of
lawfull age and it is understood that the above named cattle is
the same that have been in the possession of the above named
Isaac Cole for some years past and the said Isaac Cole and
his part do agree to keep and support the said eight head cattle
their increase until her youngest child becomes of lawfull age

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to act for himself and then the said Isaac Cole is to divide the said cattle with their increase among his children above named and as
he the said Isaac may think proper and he the said Isaac
is to enjoy the use and benefit of the milch of the said stock of
cattle while in his possession which is in compensation for his
keeping and supporting the same but is not liable for the loss or
death of any of the aforesaid cattle while in his possession and be
it further understood by them present that there is no right of
property of the said stock of cattle and their increase enclosed in
the said Isaac Cole neither is the said Isaac permitted to sell or dispose
of any of the aforesaid stock of cattle in any manner whatever
now they are not to be liable to be taken in execution for any debt or
debt due by the said Isaac Cole but also the right of property in the said
stock of cattle is hereby conveyed from the aforesaid John Thompson to
one the aforesaid children of Isaac and Margaret Cole and the said
Isaac Cole is only an agent in his lease for his aforesaid children until
the youngest son comes of lawful age - March 18, 1820 to the true meaning
and intent of the foregoing indenture we the said John Thompson
and Cole have hereunto set their hand and seal the date first above

Edward Hale of Lyle County and state of Oregon
do make this my last will and testament in manner and
form following to wit

First I desire that my executors collect the monies
due me by account or otherwise and pay out of the
same all my just debts and funeral expenses and the
overplus to be given to my son Elias Hale to help him
in the purchase of a farm if so overplus should not
exceed eight hundred dollars.

Second I desire that my wife Martha Hale have the use
of all the negroes during her natural life except my
mulatto girl Charity and Bessie which I give to my daughter
Poly also Sarah and Betty two black girls I give
to my daughter Phoebe also leave to my beloved wife all
the house hold and kitchen furniture with the
exception of a bed and furniture to each of my daugh-
ters Poly and Phoebe likewise I leave to my wife the one
third part of my plantation wherein I reside which two
shall include the dwelling house and orchard which
shall at her decease go to my son William whose
portion of land shall include all below the following
line Beginning at the creek and running up the water
down right at the back of the apple orchard to the
mouth of the first hollow on the right hand then
up s. right hand hollow to the outlet of the
whole tract the balance of the tract to be
equally divided between my sons Isaac and Daniel
also the lands wherein my son Isaac lives
together with all other joining thereto.

and otherwise disposed of shall be equally divided between my sons Isaac
and Daniel such the lands herein given to my son Isaac
and Daniel to be valued by disinterested men together
with the land wherein my son Charles lives which shall
be valued according to the state in which he rec'd it the object of
this valuation is to make my son Charles Isaac and Daniel equal
to my son Charles and Daniel to whom I gave eight hundred dollars
when they became of full age likewise my sons Sophie and Elias are
to be made equal to their older brother. Third I wish the land where
on Lindsey Davis lives to be sold within twelve months after my
decease provided he should not give & pay the sum of two hundred
dollars within the 1^o twelve months

Fourth I wish my stock of hens and cattle to be sold imm-
ediately after my decease and the amount equally divided
among my sons - my crop of tobacco now cured to be
sold at the discretion of my executors and the money
divided equally as above also I wish my executors to sell
all the farming utensils they may judge necessary to carry
on the farm assigned in the support of my wife Martha
Fifth I wish Sophy and Daniel and William each of them
to have a bed and furniture also the crop of grain now
growing if any should remain after the support necessary
to my wife and family to be sold and the money
to be divided among my sons equally

Sixth I wish my sons and daughters who have not had
their cows & calves each of them to take two cows & calves before
the cattle are sold as aforesaid likewise I wish my wife
to have the hogs, Sheep, & Geese, Waggon & gears together with
the brash tools during her natural life

Seventh I desire whatever I have left to my wife and un-
der her direction such as negroes, their tools, and farming uten-
sils household and kitchen furniture be divided equally or sole divided
among my sons above named as they may agree among themselves
