I Joseph Darr of the County of Giles and State of Virginia
do hereby make my last Will and Testament in manner
and form following to wit
First I desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses
be paid.

Second. I desire that so much of my perishable property
as may be necessary to pay my debts be sold by my ex-
ecutors and the balance to remain on the plantation for the
use of my family.

Third. I give to my wife a comfortable support out my
estate and a home where I may reside during her natural
life.

Fourth. After my youngest child attains the age of twenty
one years I desire and direct my executors to sell all my lands
and divide the proceeds of sale equally amongst my children
and until my lands are sold the home plantation is to
be for the common use and benefit of my wife and
all the now at home.

Fifth. I desire that my lands and office run be rented
until my youngest child becomes twenty one years old.

Sixth. Some of my children are now in my debt by
notes and book accounts which they must account for on
a distribution of my estate as my wish and desire is that
all my children be put on an equality.

And lastly I do hereby appoint my friends William

I, Daniel A. Fry of this County of Giles and State of Virginia do hereby make my last will and Testament in manner and form as follows to wit: First I advise that all my great debts and funeral expenses be paid:

Second I advise that all my perishable property except the apparel belonging to my two sons be sold by my executor:

Third I give and bequeath to my two sons William Parker and John Peter all my lands containing about 437 acres upon condition that they take charge of their mother and maintain her well during her natural life and that they also permit Agnes Catherine Susan and Margaret Jane to have a home on the plantation until they marry or so long as they behave themselves

Fourth I advise that my two sons pay to all my daughters the sum of fifty dollars each in Ten years after my decease provided they can do so But it is my expectation that my daughters shall ^{not} have it in their power to dis-
turb my sons for said sums

Fifth I, Chapman greatly and on one hundred and nine hundred dollars and some cents by book account out of which he is entitled to a credit of about 94 dollars for having heretofore attended on my sick family and the said Chapman agrees to give me five dollars per ann for a certain piece of land that said Chapman is now fencing and if said Chapman will strike off even with my estate and include his bill for attending on myself I do hereby authorize Wm Williams to convey a title to him for said land

Sixth Samuel Lucas is greatly indebted to me in a certain sum of money which my accounts will show
