

My Executors take in charge the Lands and a pop-
erty hereby devised to my three minor children
namely St. James Harvey and David. Tilton
and that they my said Executors do manage the
the same as guardians for the three said inf-
ant children untill they arrive at age
Twelvethly my said Executors are hereby authorized
and required to prosecute and defend all the
law suits in which I am now involved and they
are likewise required to indemnify and keep
free from injury my friend William Hlavations
of Barren county Kentucky who stands bound
as my security in an injunction bond in the
Federal Court held at Hillsford in the State
of Kentucky.

Thirtiethly It is my will and desire that each
one of my children receive an equal portion of
my estate to which end my Executors required
after the settlement of my estate to pay for my son
Refus A. the sum of eleven hundred and eighty
dollars out of his part of the personal estate of
that amount be due him upon settlement they
are also required to pay for my son David Mitten
the like sum of eleven hundred and eighty
dollars out of his part of the personal estate if
such amount be due him on settlement they are
also likewise required to pay for my son James Harvey
the sum of four hundred and eighty dollars out of
his part of the personal estate if such amount be due
him on settlement which said sums of money are
to be paid over to my other children in such prop-
tions as will make them all equal agreeably to the
managers in which I have stipulated my property hereby
devised to them but in case it should turn out upon
the settlement of my estate that there is nothing com-
ing to them except what has already been devised to
them by this will they are required to pay over to my
Executors for the purpose aforesaid the sums re-
spectively due from them to my other children but
should it appear from the settlement of my estate that
any money is due them after the payment of my debts
what ever it may be my Executors are required to pay
over the same to my other children for the purpose here-
in before specified then the residue due my other
children are to be paid to my Executors by sons Rufus
A. James H. and David M. for the purpose of making

equal all my children but should it turn out that
my son Rufus A. James H. and David M. will have
to pay the same due from each of them respectively
or any part thereof to my children out of their portion
of the estate which I have hereby devised to them or
out of their non-priest funds they are to pay the same
in five annual instalments without interest Rufus A.
payment to commence one year after my death and James
H. and David M. one year after they arrive at age
respectfully

Twelvethly It is my will and desire that what ever
sum may be due to my daughter Cynthia M. be retained
in a settlement of my estate shall be retained in
the hands of my executor who shall dispose of the
same in the manner the most conducive to her
interest and which shall be judged off by them
Thirtiethly I do hereby and appoint Rufus D.
French and son in law Samuel Pack Jr. my ex-
ecutors to this my last will & testament with full
power and authority to act in the manner herein
before specified in testimony whereof I have here-
unto prefixed my hand & seal the 27th September
1835

touching my worldly estate that God hath pleased
to bless me with I dispose of in the following manner
to wit I Give unto my well beloved wife Anna the
whole use and control of my lands and premises while
she remains my widow and as much of the house-
hold and kitchen furniture and stocks of all kinds
as she and my Executors may think needful for
her sustentance while she liveth and then take
disposeth of after her death as I do hereafter in my
will direct and I give to my youngest daughter
Jane Smith over and above what I have already
given her five dollars and the rest of my daughter
to wit Patsy Elizabeth Sally and Malinda and my
only son John are to be equal in all my estate real
and personal not otherwise directed in this my
last will and testament and I Give my wife
Anna over and above what I have already given
her an equal part with my last mentioned
daughters wanting of eighty dollars which sum
I will have to be paid to her ~~for her maintenance~~ at my
death and I also give unto my only son
John all the land lying on the north side of
the creek making the creek the line through
the tract or tracts of land he gives up his claim
on the south side of the creek to himself for the
benefit of my beloved children which I direct
to be sold immediately after the death of my wife
and all the personal estate not above given to be
sold after my death and distributed as above
directed after paying all just demands against
the estate and lastly I do nominate and appoint
my son John and Parker Lucas my executors my
two executors in this my last and testament dis-
missing all other former wills made by me
in witness whereunto I have hereunto set my
hand and affixed my seal this sixteenth day of
February and in the year of Christ one thousand
eight hundred and thirty four

revoke by disavow revoke and disavow all and
every other former testaments with legacies bequest
by me in any way before aforesaid Ratifying and con-
firming this and no other to be my last will and
testament in witness whereunto I have hereunto
