with Widow for the sum of  $\$66.67$  which makes an

After being sworn for that purpose I do certify that  
the above settlement is correctly made to the best of my  
knowledge and belief under my hand this 17<sup>th</sup> of  
January 1853.

Parker, citizen of the County of Giles and State  
of Virginia being very weak in body but perfect in mind and  
memory thanks to God for his mercy do make Constitution  
and Arrive this my last will first of all I recommend  
my soul to God who gave it and my body to the earth  
from whence it came to be decently buried in Christian  
like manner and as for my worldly goods that  
it hath pleased God to bless me with I do dispose  
of in manner and form following to wit  
First I give and bequeath unto my daughter wife  
Margaret Lucas one third of all my personal estate  
and all my household and kitchen furniture and  
all my farming utensils and also three blacks I think  
Samuel and a patten two beast one bay mare and foal  
hove and one small black boy Green and Samuel is  
to remain with my wife During her life and after her  
d<sup>r</sup> Samuel and Green is to be sold in <sup>by</sup> family the  
money to be divided between the four Price Parker  
children and Nancy Roth & her husband George both to pay  
for Price all the land west of the Valley branch which is  
to be the line and one hundred and fifty Dollars  
to be paid him out of the sale of my Personal Estate to  
be the payment of the property which he is to take  
To give my son Parker all my land lying both of the  
main road to the Valley and thence back east low  
to the corner of the Conventional line mark on a ridge  
and then down to a corner not far from the creek  
and then running same distance then down to the  
creek and with the bank some distance and  
crossing the branch to a white oak nearly opposite the  
house of Parker Lucas Jr and thence down  
and opposite the lower fence of the cleared lot and  
the fence to begin to the main Road and after her  
Price John and a patten is to be to my son Parker  
and one set of swish tools also a line to my daughter  
Susanna one Black woman named Lonna &  
her two children Liza and Lewis and all their inc  
use and one large ~~one~~ <sup>one</sup> ~~large~~ cupboard ~~one~~ <sup>one</sup>  
table four beds and furniture and all my cupboard  
furniture and all my land south west of the boundary  
line during her single life to have all the  
decease This part of the land is to fall to Parker in  
sue I also give to my daughter Nancy one Black  
woman Liza and her daughter Minerva and  
all their increase one bed and furniture etc
