

Have all now by their presents that I John Sartain of the County of Giles and State of Virginia for and in consideration of the natural love and affection which I bear to Polly Clark (wife of deceased Clark) of the County and State aforesaid as well as for the further consideration of one Dollar to one in hand paid by the said Polly Clark, at or before at or before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged having given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Polly Clark and her heirs one negro girl about five years old named Mary to have and to hold the said negro girl and her increase unto the said Polly Clark and her heirs forever and the said John Sartain for himself his heirs executors administrators the said negro girl with her increase unto the said Polly Clark and her heirs against the claim of him the said John Sartain his heirs executors administrators and against the claim of all and every person whatever but the said Polly Clark nor any other person is permitted to sell or dispose of the said Negro Girl or any of her increase for the said Polly Clark and her heirs are to enjoy the profits of the said Negro girl forever by these presents In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 16th day of September 1836

In the name of God Amen I Obadiah Rose of the County of Giles and State of Virginia being in a declining situation of body but of sound mind and memory but calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make this my last will and testament First and principally I recommend my soul to God who gave it and my body I resign to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian like manner at the discretion of my friends and Executors who may be present nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same by the power of Almighty God who gave it And as touching such worldly estate with which it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I do dispose of in the following manner and form to wit I direct that all my just debts be paid by my Executors hereunto to be named.

Then I give unto Joseph Rose my brother one dollar out of a note his son Joseph Sticks his son when collected I then give unto my sister Jane Johnston one dollar when collected out of aforesaid note I then give unto my sister Rebecca Kirk one Dollar out of the same note when collected I then give unto Lenny Rock all my properties of lands when I now live also a Cow & three also one horse and farmore utensils with all the household furniture for I also desire that Elizabeth Kirk stay on the land and receive the rent of the same and have the use of said stock and farming utensils and household furniture for the maintenance and trouble of said Lenny Rock I also desire my Executors to collect all my monies due to me and after paying my just debts to give the residue unto said Lenny Rock as my Executors may think proper and also to sell the balance of my estate not here named to sell either at private or publick sale and convert it to the use of said Lenny Rock and its Mother as they shall think proper and lastly I do nominate and appoint my friends Jacob McPherson and William Davis my Executors to this my last will and Testament revoking and disallowing all other former wills by me made declaring this to be my true will and last testament this 10th day of March 1837 to which I have subscribed my name and affixed my seal

 the uncertainty of human life, and being desirous to dispose of all
 such worldly estate as hath pleased God to bless me with I give
 and bequeath the same in manner following that is to say I give
 to my wife Naomi after the payment of my debts & funeral expenses
 all my estate both real and personal for and during the term of
 her natural life and after her decease I give the same to my
 children to be equally divided among my several children but if
 my wife should marry again then two thirds of my real estate
 to be sold by my executor and two thirds of my real estate to be
 put to the use and benefit of my several children viz, Charles
 Jordan, William, Rufus, Nathaniel, James and John which I give
 to them their heirs executors & assigns forever

And lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint
 my friends Naomi my wife & Abraham Garrison Executors
 of my last will and testament In Witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hands and affixed my seal this 9th day of
 April 1827

 to me in hand paid for and in Consideration of the following
 property (viz) four head of horn cattle sixteen head of
 hogs three feather beds and furniture, two pots one iron shelf
 furniture and thereto inclusive together with all the increase
 of my stock and earnings to be kept exclusively at the
 expiration of my death whatever remains of the above property
 and increase of the aforesaid shall be sold and equally
 divided amongst these above named children

I do hereby appoint Pleasant Webb
 with and by his consent as trustee for the said children
 and at my death will see the remaining property sold to the
 best advantage. The most proceeds shall be put to interest
 with sufficient security the notes to be collected by them and
