my soul to God who gave it and my body to the earth
from whence it came to be decently buried in Christian

it hath pleased God to bless me with I do dispose
of in manner and form following to wit
First I give and bequeath unto my daughter wife

and all my household and kitchen furniture and

made at the term appointing the undersigned Commissioner
to lay off dores for Elender Williams widow and heiret of the late
Philip Williams deceased, in the lands in which he died, Saged and
populose which was represented to us to contain about 730 acres
being part of a tract of 1130 acres granted to Alexander McPherson
in the County of Giles on both sides of Sinking Creek a
branch of New River. The whole tract is laid down in the above
plat, incorrectly shewing to whom the several parts belongs as they
was not actually surveyed by us we shall only attempt to shew
