In conformity to an order from the worshipful Court of Giles County made at the term appointing the undersigned Commissioners to lay off dower for Eleanor Williams widow and relict of the late Philip Williams deceased, in the lands in which he died seized and possessed which was represented to us to contain about 730 acres being part of a tract of 11130 acres granted to Alexander McPherson &c Situate in the County of Giles on both sides of sinking Creek a branch of New River. The whole tract is laid down in the above plat, in correctly showing to whom the several parts belong as they was not actually surveyed by us we shall only attempt to show the subdivisions by the blue line previously drawn through the same sufficient to say that we run and measured that part of said tract lying within the blue line agreed on the interior with yellow being the part laid off for the dower of said Eleanor Williams which contains 2110 acres by our calculation; and is bounded as follows To wit: Beginning at a white oak and black oak the beginning corner of said tract of 11130 acres (B in the plat) and running with a line of the part devised to younger Sigsbee 633 poles to two red oaks a pine and white oak on said line thence leaving the same 1112 633 poles passing a corner of said grant and clipping sinking - at 171 poles to a hickory and white oak stump corner to the grant leaving the line of the grant and with 66 poles line N 77 3/4 poles to two red oaks and a black oak on the top of a hill N 11 N 16 poles to a white oak and chestnut oak saplings on a cliff N 21 610 poles to a hickory and Spanish oak above the head of a Spring N 26 N 10 poles descending said Spring and Spring head to the bank of the Creek and up in the same N 22 N 37 poles to a double sugar tree on the bank leaving the Creek N 111 N 636 poles to a hickory and a small apple orchard N 68 N 110 poles including said orchard and a small meadow near the Creek and crossing the Creek to a red hawthorn on the bank thence with a fence on the said side of
