presents do bargain sell and deliver unto John Peters
Sint. of the County aforesaid One blazing face yearling
bull, One red and white Cow three yearling heifers
two freds and one black, together with all the house
hold furniture now in the possession of the said
Ford. And the said Lewis Ford doth for himself
his heirs and assigns the aforesaid property unto
the said John Peters ten his heirs and assigns
forever Warrant and defense. In Witness whereof
the said Lewis Ford hath hereunto set his hand
and seal this 13th day of February in the year
1809.

This Deed of bargain & Sale of Personal
Property from Lewis Ford to John Peters was proven
by the Oaths of Thomas O'Neill Elijah Peters and

In the name of God Amen I Paul Epling of
the County of Giles Commonwealth of Virginia being
well in perfect health and sound mind and memory but
calling to mind the mortality of my body and know-
ing that it is appointed for all men once to die

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do make this my last Will and Testament just and finally. I recommend my soul to God who gave it and my body I direct to the earth to be buried in a decent and Christianlike manner at the discretion of my friends here may be present not doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same by the power of almighty God who gives it and as touching such worldly estate with which it has pleased God to bless me in this life I dispose of in the following manner aforesaid to such I direct the all my Just debts be paid by my Personal Executors hereafter to be named out of such part of my personal estate as I shall direct to be sold. Now I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife (Miriam Epling) two milk cows to be by her chosen out of my stock of Cattle also the bed wherein I now lie and I now kettle and Pot and all other personal moveables effects of every description which she possessed or brought to me at the time of our marriage to her and her heirs or assigns forever also I desire that she my remains and her house in her life in the house which I now live in also the third of the grain of the land that I now live on. Now I give and devise unto my son John Epling his heirs and assigns forever the upper part of the land on which I live on a tract of sinking knolls he divided by lines with I have already made for that purpose also an equal part of the remainder of my personal property after my Just debts are paid out of it after an allowance is made for what he has already received which I have charged him with and at the price my Book of Accounts kept for that purpose. I also give and devise unto my son Daniel Epling him or his heirs or assigns forever the lower part

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of my land on Spruce run the line with he now lives on agreeable division lines heretofore made provided him the said Daniel to pay or cause to be paid unto Catharine Lybrook her heirs or assigns the sum of twenty eight pounds more or less Virginia Currency with its lawful interest also one year's Credit after my decease which sum of money I direct to be paid to the said Catharine Lybrook for my son Daniel. If not so paid I direct my Executors shall sell the said land to the best advantage and pay the said sum of money and if any should remain return it to said Daniel. I also will him proportionate part of my personal property after my Just debts is paid out of it and he has made an allowance for what he has already received and at price I have charged him therewith in my account book kept for that purpose heretofore made provided him the said Daniel to pay or cause to be paid unto Isaac Epling the sum of fifteen pounds of Virginia Currency to make our lands equal. I also give and devise unto my son Paul Epling his heirs or assigns forever the upper part of my land on Spruce run to be divided between him and his brother Daniel by lines already made or division lines. I also will him an equal part of the remainder of my personal estate after all my Just debts is paid out of it and he has made an allowance for what he has already received and at the price I have charged him with in account book. I also give and devise unto my son Isaac Epling and Philip Epling the remainder part of the

tracts of land wherein I now live to be equally divided
between them two. I also will each of them a proper
several part of my Personal Property after my
Just debts is paid out of it and allowance made
for what we have already received and at the
price when I exchange you with in my account book
for that purpose. I also direct that my Executors
after my decease shall sell such a part of my pro-
perty as cannot be peaceably and equally divided
between my first sons and procure equally divided
between them and lastly I do nominate and appoint
my trusty David Price and Parker Lewis take of the
County and estate above written Executors to this my
last Will and Testament revoking and annulling
all other former wills by me made declaring this
to be my true last Will and Testament this twentieth
day of January in the year of our Lord Eighteen
hundred and nine to which I have subscribed my
name and put my seal.
