First, I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it and my body to the grave to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the General resurrection I shall receive the by the mighty Powers of God and touching these worldly goods whereunto it has pleased God to bless in this life I dispose of bequeath and devise in the following manner and form to wit I give unto my dearly beloved wife Mary my dwelling house and one half of the proceeds of all my lands for five years or during the minority of my son Charles as likewise all my household and kitchen furniture also one sorrel horse and one bay mare all my stock of Cattle not otherwise

devised and all my hogs sheep and geese and after the death of my wife the house is to be the property of my sons John and Charles Dingep and all the other property to be the property of my wife and to be disposed of as she may think proper. I also give to my wife my negro woman Juba as her own property. I also give to my daughter Elizabeth Smith two dollars out of my estate I also give to my daughter Susanna Smith two dollars out of my estate. I also give to my two sons William Dingep and Peter Dingep two dollars each out of my estate. I also give to my daughter Mary French two dollars out of my estate.
