

98) In the name of God amen I Philip Williams of the County of Giles & State of Virginia being very sick but in sound mind and memory but calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die do make this my last will & testament first & principally I recommend my soul to God who gives it and my body I resign to the earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my friends who may be present nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive to the same by the power of almighty God who gives it and as touching such worldly Estate with which it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I dispose of in the following manner and form to wit, I direct that my last debts be paid by my Executors herein after to be named out of such part of my Estate as I shall direct to be sold, I then give unto my beloved wife Ellen the more cattle hogs & sheep geese & other fowls and a bed room chest and pots and tableware also to have her thirds of the land during her widowhood and if it is Gods will that she bring forth the Child that she is now with I give it the Plantation I now live on and the rest of the property is to be sold and to be Equally divided amongst the Rest of my sons & Daughters & wife Ellen and lastly I do appoint Frederick Williams and George Williams Sons to be my Executors to this my last will and testament revoking and annulling all other wills by me made & declaring this to be my true last will and testament made this fourteenth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & twelve
