 Spring or in any other part of the aforesaid state of Virginia
 so far as the said James Drumfield is interested in
 the said estate of the said John certain deceased by purchase
 by the parts of said estate from John certain and from Humphrey
 Humphrey and lately his wife they being two of the legatees
 of the said estate of John certain deceased the said parts
 shares will more fully appear by Deeds of conveyance
 of the said estate recorded in the Clerk's office of the County
 Court of Giles and the said James Drumfield deposes
 empower my said attorney to compromise arbitrate or
 settle with the widow and the other legatees of the
 said estate or any thing concerning the premises
 also to deed and receive the rents of lands here of negroes
 or provide for their maintenance as the case may be
 and at the discretion of my said attorney and then
 his to do execute all and every other lawfull and duty
 needful for recovering and receiving the possession and
 profits of my part of the aforesaid estate but to my
 use as aforesaid: as fully and effectually to all in
 tents and purposes as if I were personally present
 hereby ratifying and confirming to whatsoever my said
 attorney shall lawfully do or cause to be done in or about

I Robert Hunter of the County of Giles and State of
 Virginia do hereby make my last will and Testament in
 Manner and following to wit - First I desire that all my
 just debts and funeral expenses be paid, secondly I give
 and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Milly, the Marrian
 house and all that part of the plantation lying on the
 South side of Sinking Creek where I now live until
 her death, Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my son
 Henry at the death of my wife Milly all the land
 that I own on the South side of Sinking Creek

at the place above mentioned. Fourthly I give and bequeath unto Ben Samuel Thomas Hunter William and My Grandson Robert Hunter who is the son of my son Robert all the land that I own on the north side of Hickory Creek, Fifthly I give and bequeath unto My son Samuel Thomas Williams Henry and My Grandson Robert My lot of Blacksmith tools to be divided amongst them in whatever manner they may think right. Sixthly I give and bequeath unto my Daughters Nancy Adkins Pally Adkins Susan McCoy and my Grand Daughter Elizabeth who is the Daughter of Sarah Kirk Dec^d each to have an equal share of my personal property that I may have in my possession at the time of my death, which property may be sold at the discretion of my executor and the proceeds of such sale to be equally divided amongst my three daughters & my Grand daughter before mentioned, seventhly And lastly I do nominate and appoint my worthy friend Gasper Link my executor of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all other former wills by me made declaring this to be my last and only will I so witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 24th day of April 1829

At Test February Court 1830 This last will and Testament of Robert Hunter Dec^d was presented in court by the oath of Alexander Harlow, Christian Link and Henry Link and ordered to be recorded and an motion of Gasper Link the executor therein named who made oath and entered into bond with William Porter bail in the sum of three hundred dollars Corliss & Co

In the presence of God Amen
I James Stoddard of the county of Kent and state of Virginia being weak in body but of a sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all my worldly Estate as it has pleased God to bless me with (Sd) I desire that all my just debts be paid out of my personal estate) I do I give and bequeath to my son Edmund Stoddard all the tract of land I now possess but that John Stoddard is to have the privilege of the timber along his fence from the Meaggon Road to the end of his line five Rods wide on the north of the river & I also give unto him one clearbear place and dozens some plains and chipals and Charro that was not sold at my son I have the same to him and his heirs forever which is free part of my Estate real and personal and he is also to pay three hundred dollars to the other heirs entitled to the same ^{ten} years after my death And also I give to my son George Stoddard and John Stoddard twenty dollars each for their free part of my estate I also give to my Grand Daughter Nancy Stoddard one woman's saddle. The balance of my estate I give to my son Joseph Stoddard Ralph Stoddard James Stoddard Thomas Stoddard Margaret Jinner, Ben Hope Jane Williams Elizabeth Stoddard Catharine & Michael and Susanah Stoddard to be equally divided among them, I also give my blackman Thomas his freedom at my death provided he complies with the law in leaving the State if he fails to do so in so doing he is to remain the property of the heirs and to go their benefit Lastly I do hereby appoint my son Edmund Stoddard and Daniel Page Executors of this my last will and Testament so witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 19th day of January 1830
