

Colmston the rec^t whereof is hereby acknowledged hath this day Bargained and sold unto the saids George Johnston one Grey Mare about twelve years olds and Mans Saddle and one Bridle the title whereof is the said James A Williams will warrant and for use defend unto the saids George Johnston upon Trust Now if the said James A William shall will and truly pay unto the said Isaac & W Chapman the aforesaid sum of fifty nine Dollars and 45 cents with the interest from the 1st of November 1823 on or before the 1st day of April 1824. then this obligation to be void But if the said James A Williams shall fail to make the aforesaid pay by the 1st of April next then the saids George Johnston is to take possession of the saids Grey mare Saddle and Bridle and expose the same to sale for ready money by advertising of the same ten days at the front door of the Court house and out of the money arising from the said sale after deducting of the cost of drawing and recording this Trust to apply the proceeds to the settlement of the said sum of Fifty nine Dollars and 45 cents with the interest or any part there may be due then on at that time and the balance if any to pay over to the said James A Williams or his legal representatives.
