and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to
dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with
I hereby give and bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Allen and my son
James Allen my wife's birth and marriage all this above I give unto her during
her natural life and further I give and bequeath unto her the back shed
Room and Room up stairs with a fire place in and all the house hold furniture
of all kinds except that may be more specially named here after and also all the
Kitchen furniture in the same way as the household furniture we left and also
I give her four ewes of her own and a black pig of the weight of 100 lbs and one
leather pail and I should two pair of horse shoes and one third part of the
Wagon and it my will and desire that the house hold furniture and kitchen
furniture horse cattle sheep and hogs as above mentioned to be at her will to
dispose of them at her death as she may think for best and it is my will and
desire that my wife and my son William Allen pay my daughter Elizabeth Shannon
one hundred dollars within two years after my decease in property
I give unto my son William Allen the home plantation to him and his heirs
for ever and also a small parcel of Lane Lign on the north side of the
Wagon road purchase of Ephraim Dunbar dead and one negro boy and Henry
and one half of my estate after Eliza receive his part and half my hogs and
two thirds of the wagon and all the Gear the South tools and all my farming tools
of all kinds and Bed room furniture and two Acres
I give to my daughter Eliza Allen one West more to sell & build eight
hundred colts three tons & furniture bed room linen and table Linen
and kitchen furniture She is to have out of my house to make her equal
with my daughter Sully and Sally Shannon and also that part of land
bought of Ephraim Dunbar and name by the Cooksey piece and one
negro Lind named Lemina
It is my will and desire that the negro left to my wife is to be
equally divided among my four children at their mother's death

I give to my daughter Sully Shannon her back shed but that is in my
power including the water that is now within the same fence
7th It is my will and desire that my wife and my son William Allen pay all my
Just debts and funeral Expenses
8th that all that my daughter Sally Shannon has all ready received of me
I give unto her and her heirs for ever
9th An a second thought to make my children more safe and to make
the first Section of my will more plain to the under stand It is my will
and desire that my wife is to have the property mentioned in the first Section
with this Reserve that is to say if she shall change her way of living and marry
them in that case She is not to have that property to do as she please with
but at her death that property is to be equally divided among my several
Children and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends my
wife Sally Allen Thomas Shannon and my son William Allen Executors
of my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other or former
wills or testaments by me here before made in writing whereof I have
here unto set my hand and affixed my seal this 28th day of June in
the Year of our Lord 1829
