I Thomas Farley of the County of Giles and State of Virginia being sworn in body Subscribed of Sound Mind and Memory do Satisfy and Regulate all my worldly affairs in the way and manner following
First I bequeath my Soul to God who gave it and my body to the worms
Second it is my wish that my grave be Paved round and the expenses taken out of my Estate
Third all my legal Debts and funeral expenses are to be paid
Fourth I bequeath to my Daughter Mahala Farley one dollar
Fifth I bequeath to my Daughter Susan Thompson one dollar
Sixth I bequeath to my Son John B. Farley one dollar
Seventh I bequeath to my Daughter Judith B. Farley the plantation on which I now reside with several other tracts joining to it containing in all about three hundred acres be it more or less of the same which I deceded her hitherto with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging she is to have the same at the death of her mother with all the benefits arising therefrom also other property which I gave to her hitherto namely one mare and her increase one feather bed one cow and calf and one two year old heifer also all the hogs and sheep which I now possess one land and her graving one guinea and six window chairs also one copper Cattle at the death of her mother
Eighth I bequeath to my Son Thomas Farley one dollar
Ninth I bequeath to my grand Daughter Judith Thompson fifty dollars to be paid out of my estate
Tenth I bequeath to my grand Daughter Helen Farley a small tract of land about 18 acres on which Wm. Headens formerly lived joining Edwards Eatons plantation also another tract of land joining to it on the North Side of the side of Walker Creek beginning on a corner of John Harmons line on the North side of a hill and ascending thence N 33 W 60 P to two white oaks on a hill N 30 E 90 P to two white oaks sapling on the North side of hill N 40 E 74 P and from thence an open line to the beginning also to about 15 acres joining to it of an enclosed Survey I bought of French Eleventh I bequeath to my grand Son Thos Farley the plantation on which his father now lives containing about 300 acres also the Smith Tools which his father now has in possession
Twelfth I bequeath to my grand Son Thos Farley a plantation on the East side of Walker Creek containing about 100 acres
