I, William Brown Sen of the County
of Hills being Sick and weak in body, but of sound mind and
disposing memory for which I thank God, and calling to mind
the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of
all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with.
I give and bequeath the same in the manner following that is to say
First I give to my Son William H Brown the remaining part of
my home place on the creek together with the place adjoining to
it known by the name of the Ray place to him and his heirs forever
also I give to him my Son William H Brown all of my negro
and Cattle, Sheep and hogs I own at the place for which he is
to take good and proper care of the same during my life time
and I give to my daughter Polly Allen her share of twenty
dollars to be paid to her twelve months after my decease by
my Son William H Brown.
5th I give to my daughter Elizabeth or Betsey Shugart twenty
dollars to be paid to her or her twenty four months after my
decease by my Son William Brown
6th I also give to my daughter Sarah Cecile twenty dollars
to be paid to her thirty six months after my decease by my Son
William H Brown
7th and 8th I give to my daughter Nancy Davison twenty dollars
to be paid her in the above manner four years after my decease
by William H Brown
9th I give to my daughter Julia H Davison as many of my
negroes as she shall see proper of her own family to her and
her heirs forever. I also look for care from my daughter Julia for
smoking her such a large bag and also my other daughters.
And finally I do hereby constitute and appoint my Son William
H Brown and John Johnston, executors, execution of the my
last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other wills
made or testament by me heretofore made.

this 27th day of September in the year of our Lord 1811

make this my last will and Testament. In the first place after
my decease I desire that my body be buried in a decent
Christian like manner and my soul I return to God who gave
it, and as touching such worldly estate as it hath pleased God
to bless me with I dispose of in the following manner I give
to my grand children the heirs of John Jane Smith all
my real and personal estate &c. the money arising from the
Sale thereof which I direct to be sold to the best advantage
after my decease and the money to be put out upon interest
for their benefit and to equally divided among them as they
may become of age and if my daughter Jane Warner have any
other children than the ones now born I desire that they be equal
to those that are already born I will that my executor hereafter
named if Jane my eldest daughter is likely at any time to be
brought out of a house and home to take the money and buy a
piece of land with it if any can be bought that she shall the
can raise her children and land children to belong to the children
in stead of the money after the decease of said daughter the land
is to be thus divided off by three parts and Jane cut off with
five dollars and what was left to Jane being intended for Jane
and her children. I desire that it be disposed of as above mentioned
and that the rest of my children may not think hard of what
I have done And lastly I do appoint and nominate John Miller

my whole and sole executor to the my last will and Testament

that it is appointed for all men once to die, do hereby make
this my last will and Testament. Principally and first of all
I recommend my soul to almighty God who gave it and
my body to the earth to be buried in Christian burial at the
discretion of my executor. And as touching my worldly estate
wherein it has pleased God to bless me with in this life.
I give and dispose of the same in the manner and form following
that is to say
1st My will and desire is that my horse and my Stock of cattle
together with my house hold furniture do first sold by my
executor and out the first place pay my funeral expenses and my
just debts and should there be any surplus left arising from
the Sale of said property, after paying my funeral expenses
and my debts the said surplus to be equally divided between
my two daughters Jane King and Hannah Kesteven
2nd I give and bequeath unto my said two daughters Jane
King and Hannah Kesteven and their heirs the sum of one hundred
dollars as per my note which I hold against my son Thomas
Shannon Jane the first for the sum of the hundred dollars pay
able the first day of November 1838. The same for the sum of
two hundred dollars due the first day of November 1840. which
said note my will and desire is that be collected by my exe-
cutor and paid equally to my said two daughters Jane King and
Hannah Kesteven, to each of living & if both living then to be paid
one half to be legat him of the said Jane King and the other
half to the legat him of the said Hannah Kesteven. And
