 and during the lifetime of my wife Semina
 Hall and the said Isaac Chapman & Henry
 Chapman, is to have the labour possession use
 and controul of the said Negro Girl during the
 lifetime of my wife Semina Hall for the execution
 I owe them as before mentioned and they the said
 Isaac Chapman & Henry Chapman are to have
 the labour possession or use of said slave Betty
 in proportion to the sum which I am owing them
 or in any other proportion that they may agree on
 between themselves - and the said Isaac Chapman
 and Henry Chapman & Henry Chapman & Henry Chapman
 with the said Charles Hall that they the said Isaac
 Chapman & Henry Chapman or their heirs will

Convey and transfer unto the children of Semina Hall
 wife of said Charles Hall of her the said Semina Hall
 death the said Negro Girl Betty and her increase
