In the name of God, Amen, I Beverly Russell of Gloucester County, do make this my last will and testament, as follows
I direct that my body be buried, at an expense not to exceed Fifteen (\$15.00) dollars

I direct that all my just debts be paid And to such other worldly Estate as I may be seized or possessed of, I dispose of the same as follows,

First, I give and devise that tract of land lying in the County of Gloucester, adjoining the land purchased by Washington Lancaster, containing Eleven Acres more or less, to my daughter Emma Russell

Secondly, I give and devise that tract of land lying in the County of Gloucester (adjoining the land of Tom Morris, and land given to my daughter Emma) containing Eleven Acres more or less, to my daughter Ellen Russell

Thirdly, I devise that my Executors, which shall be named, to pay to each of my children, (that I name in this clause) the sum of Fifty cents, Lucy Washington, Peter Proxton, Fanny Stubbs, Robert R. Russell.

Fourthly, And as to all the residue of my estate, real, and personal which shall remain after payment of the expenses of my Funeral, and my debts, and after satisfying and liquidating the devises, and legacies aforesaid, I give, devise, and bequeath the same to my wife Belle Russell, as long as she may live.

Secondly, I give and devise that tract of land lying in the
County of Gloucester (adjoining the land of Tom Morris, and
land given to my daughter Emma) containing Eleven Acres more
or less, to my daughter Ellen Russell.


Thirdly, I desire that my Executors, which shall be named, to pay
to each of my children (that I name in this clause) the sum of
Fifty cents, Lucy Washington, Betsey Proxton, Fanny Stables,
Robert R. Russell.

Fourthly, And as to all the residue of my estate, real, and
personal which shall remain after payment of the expenses
of my Funeral, and my debts, and after satisfying and
liquidating the devises, and legacies aforesaid, I give, devise,
and bequeath the same to my wife Sallie Russell, as long as
she may live, and at her death, the residue of my estate,
real, and personal, I give, devise and bequeath to my
grandchild Clarissa George Luckett.

Fifthly, I appoint my said wife Sallie Russell, Executrix
of this my Will, and desire that no security shall be required
of her as such.

Sixthly I hereby revoke all previous wills and codicils
hitherto made by me.
