Richardson, all my property both real and personal during his life, and at his death my will and desire is, that all my property both real and personal, shall be equally divided among my children Rosa C. Richardson, Maggie E. Pentuss and William H. Richardson and their descendants in equal portions, the children of each of my children taking and dividing between them equally, the portion which would have fallen to their parents, if dead.

Third, I give to my adopted son, and the stepson of my

husband William S Ingram absolutely, and in fee Simple, after the death of my husband, the Buggy and Harness, which I purchased with my own means, a feather Bed, Bedstead, Pillow and Bolster, a pair of Blankets, a pair of Shirts, one comfort, one quilt, and two Counterpanes, a white & a colored Counterpane, Six new chairs now in my house and one large Rocking chair, with a cane seat. I wish no Inventory or appraisement of my Estate.

I appoint my friend and neighbour, Capt. James W. Robins Executor of this my last will and Testament and wish no security required of him and request that the Court will not require of him security as I have in him entire Confidence to execute this my last will & Testament impartially & honestly.
