Bland the sum of five dollars to him and his heirs forever. 3rd I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary H. Milby the sum of five dollars to her and her heirs forever. 4th In consideration of my two youngest Joshuaway I Lynus B. Bland being under the age of twenty one, and I having done more for the other three children than I have for the two youngest. 5th I give to my two sons Joshuaway I and Lynus B. Bland all the rest of my personal estate of what nature or kind soever it may be to be divided equally between

them. It is my will and desire that no sale be made of the propert that my to youngest Sons Joshua T and Synus P Bland and my Ex^{or} shall select three discreet gentlemen to value and divid the personal property between my to Sons Joshua T and Synus P. Bland. But if eather of my two youngest Sons die before he arrive to the age of twenty one years of age, then in that case his share, or the the property allotted to him is to be divided between my three youngest children, namely Wm. C. Bland, Mary H. Milby and thee younger one of the two that may then be living, and last I do hereby make and appoint my Son Wm. C.
