Secondly I give my two Negro Boys Ned and James sons of my negro Woman Sophy to my nephew John Thomas Hoskins of the County of King & Queen in fee simple. Thirdly I give my negro Gul Rose and her future increase to my niece Ella Robbins for life and after her death to her surviving children in fee simple. Fourthly I give my Negro Gul Jane and her future increase to my niece Ann Eliza Robbins for life and after her death to her surviving children in fee simple.

In the event of any of my above mentioned Nieces dying without leaving children surviving to them que, their slaves hereby devised to such one for life to the survivor or survivors for life with remainder to the children of such survivor or survivors in fee simple such children to take per stirpes. Fifthly I give my maid Emmeline and her child Dolly with their future increase to my niece Lucy wife of Joseph Smither of the County of Middlesex for life and after her death to her surviving children in fee simple I also give her my Silver Spoons. Sixthly I give my nephew William Hoskins my carriage and Horses stock and farming utensils. I desire my Household and Kitchen furniture to be given to my niece Louisa Hoskins. I also desire my gold watch to be given to Thomas T Hoskins son of my nephew John Thomas Hoskins of King & Queen County and the bed and bedding upon which Mary Frances Blake now sleeps to be given to Mary Frances Blake. I desire my silver cream pot to be also given to my niece Ella Robbins. I appoint Thomas Stalifano of the County of Gloucester as Executor to this my last will and testament and desire that he will see all my lawful debts paid and my executors fees allowed. I have, to be used at his discretion

I then give, then places hereby devised to such one for life to the survivor or survivors of me  
with remainder to the children of such survivor or survivors in fee simple. Such children

Mary F Blake the other Wtness thereto subscribed being dead the said Leah S Taliaferro

deposed That she is well acquainted with the handwriting of the said Mary F Blake and that the said Mary F Blake signed her name to the said will in her presence whereupon the said will was induced to be recorded as the true last will and testament of the said Dorothy Singleton deceased and a record made.

In the name of God Amen. I James B Ware of Gloucester County being weak in body but in sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament as follows. I give to my brother Augustus Ware a portion of my land during his life time and at his death I give it to his children the line beginning at a Hickamore tree that is broke down forming William Blain's land running from thence on the North side of the grave yard bounded by the grave yard and from thence to the aforesaid Augustus Ware land and all the balance of my land I give to my sister Commodine S Chapman during her life time and at her death I give it to her two children named Christopher C Chapman and William C Chapman forever and I also wish my brother and sister both to be equally bound to pay my debts together. I acknowledge this to be my hand and seal in presence of these witnesses this the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of December 1865
