The House in which I live with an equal portion of Land of all kind to belong to my son Frank and his children. The same that my son Henry lives in with an equal portion of Land of all kind to belong to him and his children. Second I direct That Five head of Cattle whereby given to my 4 Daughters Ann Elizabeth daughter of my son Henry. Third I direct That one big red Heifer be given to my son Frank and a small red Heifer and a pair small yearlings to my Grand son James Henry son of Frank. The balance of all my live stock to be equally divided between my two sons Henry and Frank. and I do hereby make and declare my two sons Henry and Frank Executors of this my last will and Testament. One share I loan to my daughter Julia Leigh (who intermarried with Richard Leigh) and at her death I give the said share to her children

And it is my wish and desire that my dear wife will live with my son Schuyler Bland on that portion of my land which she has resided and which will be known after her death
