Having made a purchase of Enfield, with the assistance of my sister Mrs R. R. Tompkins who desires that my children who reside at Enfield, Mollie E Jones, William F Jones, Horace W. Jones & Robert E Jones shall be happy in their home and to effect this, I give exclusively and entirely Enfield to Mollie E Jones so long as she remains single, if she should marry & they all desire it, Enfield may be sold, and the profits divided, but one dissenting voice may prevent a sale, if they desire to retain ^{it} as a home. The payments on Enfield have all been made with an exception of a portion of the last decr 3.rd Dec 79, should I die before before this last payment is fully satisfied, it must be settled by money due me now from the sale of land in Hancock Co Ky, and the home for my ^{dear} children fully & entirely secured. This will made, this the 28th day of October 1880, I John H. Jones a citizen of Gloucester County Va. and owning a tract of land on the road leading from the Sasapace to Jefferson Hughes Store; do this day in the presents of my wife Lilli Jones, and three witnesses (Godfrey Cook, Anthony Cook & Wm. B. Weaver) make my will which is not to be broken. I, John H. Jones do will to Sarah Jones, and Mary Jones 10, Ten acres of land, five acres each, on the West side of my tract which they are to possess after my death. And the remainder of my land, 38 acres, I do will to my wife (Lillie Jones), which she is to possess after my death so long as she remains my widow. If she dies my widow my daughter Aden J. Jones is to possess it, if living. If she marries she is then to claim her third, and the other to go to my daughter if living. After the death of my widow it is to go to my daughter if living, and if she dies under age it is to go to my relation in the Jones family.
