"Will"

In the name of God amen. I Georgia C Pearce being in feeble health but of sound mind do hereby constitute and appoint make this my last will and testament revoking all former wills and testaments to wit. I bequeath unto my beloved husband Alexander W Pearce all of my real estate consisting of fifty six  $\frac{7}{8}$  acres of land adjoining the lands of Hubert and others being the same ceded to me by my father William D Pointer during his lifetime and situated as described in said deed 2<sup>nd</sup>. I bequeath unto the said Alexander W Pearce all money or monies due or that may become due to me from the sale of the personal property belonging to the estate of my father William D Pointer dec<sup>d</sup> also all right title and interest whether in money or real estate in the property loaned or given to my brother John W Pointer dec<sup>d</sup> by his father William D Pointer dec<sup>d</sup>, all of which I again bequeath unto my beloved husband Alexander W Pearce forever and if it is required by law that there should be a qualification upon my effects I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved husband Alexander W Pearce (whom I have made my sole heir at law) my executor without security to his Official bond and as witness whereof I hereunto affix my hand and seal this the 5<sup>th</sup> day of November the year of our Lord 1873. At a Court of quarterly Session begun and held for Gloucester County at the Courthouse on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of March 1874 this last will and testament of Georgia C Pearce dec<sup>d</sup> was produced in Court for proof and proved there being no subscribing witnesses thereto, James D Pointer and A M Pointer were sworn and severally deposed that they were well acquainted with the hand writing of the testatrix and truly believe the handwriting and the name thereto subscribed to be written by the testatrix own hand, and thereupon the said writing was Ordered to be recorded and is recorded
