In the name of God aman, I George Haynes of the County of Gloucester in the State of Virginia, being of sound mind and memory but weak and feeble in health, do therefore make, ordain, publish and declare this to be my last will and Testament, that is to say first after all my lawful debts and funeral expences paid and discharged, the residue of my estate real and personally I hond to my beloved wife during the time of her natural life and after her death if she should be the longest liver.

I give all of my real estate now in my possession it being the tract of land that I now reside on to my son Charles E. Haynes and his heirs forever at my death or at the death of his mother if she should out live me - I give to my son William J. Haynes and my daughter Mary A. Massie, sixty dollars to each one of them or their heirs to be paid by my son

Charles & Hanes in Twelve months after my death or the death of my wife if she should be the longest liver or not live me, it being three portions of my real estate. I desire that my Executor hereafter named shall sell off all my personal property, and net proceeds be divided as follows. To Charles & Hanes one half, as he has bought out my son George H. Hanes in both my real & personal estate and pay to William J. Hanes, one fourth, and to my daughter Mary A. Massee one fourth. It is to be expressly to be understood that if my health should give way so that I should not be able to support myself and wife, then in that case my three children, Chas & Wm. J. Hanes and my daughter Mary A. Massee is to help to support me and my wife, and if my son Wm. J. Hanes and my daughter Mary A. Massee or her husband shall either of them refuse or fail to pay their portion or one third when call on by me or my wife or by my son Charles & Hanes, and he or s^d Charles & Hanes shall have to support us, then in that case my son Charles & shall deduct the amount due for my support first from the Sixty dollars, that he is to pay to either one default, as I desire that each one shall bear his part in the expenses of our support.

And I hereby nominate and make, constitute and appoint my son Charles & Hanes to be Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former will by me made and as I have full confidence in my s^d son Charles & Hanes I hope, the Court that this will may be offered for probat, will not require him to give security. In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribe my name and affixed my seal this 17th day of September 1877.
