At a Court of Chancery (sitting as a Court of Probate and record) held for the said City at the Court room on Wednesday February 8th 1882. A paper writing purporting to be the last will and Testament of George W Mumford

late of this body deceased was this day produced to the Court for proof and there being no subscribing Witnesses thereto Charles Ellis and John L. Mosby were sworn and severally deposed that they are well acquainted with the hand writing of the said decedent and verily believe the said writing and the name thereto subscribed to be wholly in the hand writing of the said George W. Munford deceased, and that at the date of the said writing to wit, 5th October 1881 the said Testator was of sound mind and memory thereupon the said will was established as the true last will and testament of George W. Munford deceased and ordered to be recorded as such, and on the motion of Elizabeth T. Munford the only executrix in the said will named who made oath as the law directs and entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Seven dollars conditional according to law (but without security the will directing that none should be required of her) Certificate is granted the said Elizabeth T. Munford for obtaining probate of the said will in due form. The Testator requesting that no appraisement be made of his estate, no appraisers are appointed by the Court.
