

Kemp I Gregory Kemp of the County of Gloucester and State of Virginia
do make and declare this my last will and testament in man-
ner and form following, that is to say - I devise and bequeath
to my son Augustine Kemp in fee simple twenty five (25) acres
of land in such proportions of wood and open land as he may
elect, the said land to be laid off to him, beginning on
Elijah Bridges line, and running in any direction he may
choose, but not to approach in any direction nearer than
within one hundred and fifty yards of my present dwelling
House.

✓ The rest of my estate both real and personal I devise and be-
queath to my present wife, so long as she remains my widow,
for her life, and at her death to her children in equal proportions
the surviving child or children should any die unmarried and
without issue taking in equal proportions the dead Brother or
Sisters portion - But should my wife survive all the children
born to her by virtue of our marriage, then I desire at her
death, or upon her marrying again leaving no children, all the
property hereby bequeathed to her, and her children, to be equal-
ly divided between my son Augustine Kemp and my daugh-
ters of my first marriage, free from the marital rights of
their husbands and in their sole and separate use - I nominate
and appoint my friend Nathaniel Kemp Executor of this
my last will and testament. I give to my wife absolutely
all the property which came to me through her, at the
time of my marriage. In witness whereof I have
unto subscribed my name, and affixed my seal this

the sixth day of January (1873) one thousand eight hundred and Seventy three
