I Harriet P. Sheldon being of sound mind though crippled and weak in body wish herein to dispose of by will the little worldly property I possess. That having done with temporal things my thoughts and affections may be given to that world to which I believe I am fast hastening. I leave my cousin Manner T. Jones & my nephew John Page of Clarke as Trustees of my Fox Court property in London to be kept in trust by them for the benefit of Mr Sheldon as long as he lives. The interest to be paid him annually. At the death of Mr Sheldon, I wish this property equally divided between my sister Isabella S. Burwell & three children Lucy Manner Page, Fanny T. Harrison and William Taylor Burwell. But before this division take place, I wish one hundred dollars to be paid to Matthew T. Page & \$100 to Matthew T. Curtis and the same sum to Sally S. Curtis. To lay lay out in

books, silver or any little memento of me they may choose, To Martha Page I also give & bequeath my servant Gabriella Lightfoot, I wish her well & care for as she has been both useful and faithful to several members of my family and I feel much attached to her and believe she would prefer living with Martha to any one else and that Martha will do the best part by her she can. Gabriella daughter of Harriet Peyton, I give & bequeath to my niece Lucy M Page and at her death to her eldest daughter Agnes Page. Harriet is not to be sold for any debts of the family but she and her children if she has any are to remain as appendages to Lucy family as long as they live. In these two servants Gabriella and Harriet there is a debt of five hundred dollars due to one of my best friends Mr C C Carter this \$500 with the interest on it for five or six years must be paid back to him. I now hold his bond for six hundred dollars, which if I still retained at the time of my death will in fact liquidate this debt. The rest must be paid from the hire of the servants before they are given up. There is also one hundred dollars due to Warrin J Jones he paid on these servants, which \$100 - must be paid to him out of the Free Court property. My furniture and other little things which I shall leave to my dear Cousins Mr Page and Mr Carter will dispose of as I have desired in a memorandum which I shall leave with them. To all of my dear friends I leave much love and many thanks for their kindness to myself and dear husband. May the Lord reward each and all of them with a Heavenly inheritance is my earnest prayer.
