In the name of God amen. I Henry Roane of Gloucester County and State of Virginia being
of sound mind i make this to be my last will and testament of paying all of
my just debts.

1 I give to my three Grand Children Edith John and William Atkins
Children of my daughter Sarah J Atkins dec a piece or lot of Land con-
taining one hundred and fifteen acres it being a portion of the tract of land
known as freewill adjoining the land of Alexander Atkins and other
the said land and proceeds to be bare for the sum of thirty five dol-
lars and interest annually ^{Gloucester Co. Virginia Wills 1862-1896} for my support and if
^{www.virginiapioneers.net} not paid to me during my life to be collected and equally divided between
my children or their heirs at my death.

2 I give to my daughter Georgianne Farinholt a piece of land con-
taining one hundred fifteen acres it being a portion of the tract called
foxes and adjoining the land of her husband John Farinholt the
same to be equal as the above for the rents.

3 Give to my daughter Mary T. Roane one hundred and fifteen
acres of Land known as foxes where Ricard W Roane now live
and as laid down in plot the same equally as the above for the
rents.

4 I give to my daughter Virginia A. Merrieth one hundred and
fifteen acres of land known as foxes the same equal as the

above for the rents.

5 I give to my son Thomas B Roane one hundred and fifteen acres of land it being a portion of my horse tract as laid down on plot the same equal as the above for the rents.

6 I give to my son Hanford H. Roane a certain piece or parcel of land containing one hundred and fourteen & half acres it containing buildings & the same equal as the above for the rents.

Lastly my desire is that all of the ballance of my estate both real and personal shall be equally divided between my children or their heirs. As witness where of I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the tenth day of April 1879
