and dispose of as follows: To my beloved Wife, all the
land and appurtenances situated thereon, known and
described, as the "Old Place" farm situated in the County
of Gloucester State of Virginia, together with my interest
in Saw Mill, now possessed by me, I desire that my share
in the Saw Mill and my interest in Cask or Boards
(which must be gone) when we be received therefor, to be
drawn by her, also I desire that she does not use the
principal unless compelled so long as she remains an
widow and that my whole estate (Real and Personal) be divided
equally among my three children when my youngest child becomes
of age except my son John who is to have One hundred dol-
lars (\$100) or the value thereof, but which he has already
received I desire that none of the heirs sell any of their shares
except to each other, I also desire that my son John have man-
agement of the farm so long as he is obedient, to his Mother
I desire I make, constitute and appoint, B Foster Leigh
and Henry S Meares to be executors of this my last Will
and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me

agement of the farm so long as he is obedient, to his Mother
Elizabeth, Sarah, Consulate and appoint, B Foster Leigh
and Henry S. Weaver to be executors of this my last will
and Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills by me
