my land during his life time and at his death I give it to his children the line
beginning at a Sycamore tree that is broke down joining William Plaud
land running from there on the north side of the grave yard bounded by the
grave yard and from there to the aforesaid Augustus Ware land and
all the balance of my land I give to my sister Emmeline S Chapman
during her life time and at her death I give it to her two children name
Christopher S Chapman and William S Chapman forever and I also wish
my brother and sister both to be equally bound to pay my debts together. I
acknowledge this to be my hand and seal in presence of three witnesses
this the 22nd day of September 1866 James B Ware Seal
