In the Name of God Amen. I James B Warre of Gloucester County do  
being weak in body but in sound mind and memory do make this my last  
will and testament as follows. I leave to my brother Augustus Warre a portion of  
my land during his life time and at his death I give it to his children the lines  
beginning at a Sycamore tree that is broken down forming William B's land  
land running from thence on the North side of the grave yard bounded by the  
grave yard and from thence to the aforesaid Augustus Warre land and  
all the balance of my land I leave to my sister Emmeline S Chapman  
during her life time and at her death I give it to her two children name  
Christopher C Chapman and William C Chapman forever and I also wish  
my brother and sister both to be equally bound to pay my debt together. I  
acknowledge this to be my hand and seal in presence of these witnesses  
this the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of December 1866.
