The last will and testament of William Andrews of the County of Gloucester State of Virginia made this twenty fourth day of May in the year eighteen hundred and sixty seven in the manner and form following that is to say

1st I desire that all of my just debts be paid out of my estate as soon after my decease as may be convenient and should I not leave a sufficiency in cash or bonds and other movable obligations due me to pay my debts then for this purpose I wish my executor hereafter named to consult my wife as to what portion of my estate will best suit to make sale of and they execute their discretion in making such sale. But should any portion of said cash bonds
