And as my debts will be inconsiderable, I request that the court of Gloucester will permit my sole executrix, to qualify to this my last will and testament without demanding security of her, the whole of the above being written in my own hand writing In testimony of which I hereby set my hand and seal this 20th day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy one

An instrument of writing purporting to be the last will and testament of Janus K. Dabney was this day produced in court by Mrs. Sarah E. Dabney the Executrix and proved by the oath of Sheppard Miller one of the subscribing witnesses thereto who also made oath that Tazewell Thompson the other subscribing witness thereto was present and signed the said will as a witness and the said will was acknowledged by the testator in their presence the said witnesses and testator being present at the same time and it appearing that the said will was wholly written in the hand writing of the testator. J.S. Saloofus and J.P. Dabney were sworn and severally deposed that they are well acquainted with the testators hand writing and verily believe the hand writing and the name

W.S. Myles.

An instrument of writing purporting to be the last will & testament of James H. Dabney died was this day produced in court by Mrs. Sarah E. Dabney the Executrix and proved by the oath of Sheppard Miller one of the subscribing witnesses thereto who also made oath that Tazewell Thompson the other subscribing witness thereto was present and signed the said will as a witness and the said will was acknowledged by the testator in their presence the said witnesses and testator being present at the same time and it appearing that the said will was wholly written in the hand writing of the testator. J.S. Saloafus and J.P. Dabney were sworn and severally deposed that they are well acquainted with the testator's hand writing and verily believe the hand writing and the name thereto subscribed to be the hand writing and the name of the testator's own hand whereupon the said writing is ordered to be recorded as the last will and testament of the said James H. Dabney died. Whereupon on Motion of Mrs. Sarah E. Dabney the only Executrix, who made oath as the law directs who entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Ten thousand dollars with condition according to law without security the testator by his said will requiring unto which bond is made to be recorded Certificate is granted the said Mrs. Sarah E. Dabney for obtaining a probat of the said will in due form. and the said will is recorded
