I John Bohannon, of the County of Gloucester & State of Virginia do make this my last Will and testament hereby revoking all other ^{will} wills made by me. Viz 1st It is my Will and desire that my executor hereafter named do from whatever debts that may be due me and the Sales of such of my estate as can be best sold or disposed of pay all my just debts - 2nd I give and bequeath unto my wife Susan all of my whole estate to her and her heirs forever, after the payment of my debts above mentioned. 3rd I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend Mat. N. Kemp executor to this my last Will and the Court of Gloucester County not to require security of him as I know he will do justice in the administration of my estate in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 5th day of February 1830
