I, John Hogg of Gloucester Co Va being of sound mind and disposing memory do make and declare this to be my last Will and Testament. Wherby appointing all others hitherto made by me -

I desire first of all that if at the time of my decease I shall owe any just debt or obligation for it to be paid by my administrator herein mentioned. I give and bequeath my estate both real and personal as follows: to say - 1st Having the most perfect confidence in the fidelity and good will of my two Brothers Thomas Hogg and James Hogg I commit to their care and keeping the persons of my three little children desiring that the Court shall let my Brother Thomas Hogg qualify as their legal Guardian without security. 2nd Gloucester Co Virginia Wills 1862-1896

to them jointly and absolutely all right and title to all my real and real estate of which I may be seized and possessed to their own proper use and ownership. Knowing that they will use the same wisely in keeping and maintaining my children and in thus giving all my property both real and personal to these my aforesaid Brothers that I am disposing of the same to the very best advantage of my children. 3rd I wish it to be positively understood that neither of my aforesaid Brothers Thomas Hogg and James Hogg shall ever be chargeable to any of my said children for any part of the property hereby Will'd and bequeath'd to my said Brothers, and I hereby ask the Court to allow my Brother Thomas Hogg to qualify as my administrator
