Jno. L. Sibble

In Camp 26th Regt 9th Vol. Chaffins Farm Eight Miles below Richmond 10th
September 1862 $\frac{1}{2}$ past nine P M I John L. Sibble of the County of Gloucester
and State of Virginia do make and publish this my last will and testament
revoking all others heretofore made. I thus 1st I desire after my death that all
my just debts shall be paid. 2nd After the payment of my just debts let the residue
of my estate be divided into equal parts and distributed as follows by
one part to my stepson Joshua L. Ganett two little children named Ann Leigh
Ganett and Leggie Jane Ganett, and the other part to my brother Henry F. Sibble
children the County Court will appoint trustees to hold and distribute to my bro-
ther's children at such times and in such manner as said trustees in his judi-
-ment may deem most proper or as the Court may direct, perhaps his female children
may require an expenditure for education and as they severally arrive at lawful age to
secure each his or her respective share. 3rd I desire the best possible care to be taken of
my negroes; let them be divided without sale if possible, otherwise let them select pur-
chasers if they can make judicious selection. 4th I appoint W. Myrdham Sampson
my stepson Joshua L. Ganett my executors and hope they will consent to act.

At a Court held for King & Queen County at the Court House on Thursday the 3rd
day of December 1863. This writing purporting to be last will and Testament of John
L. Sibble deceased was offered for proof by Joshua L. Ganett one of the executors
there named and this being no subscribing witness to the same Robert B.
Pry and Ira B. Cantham were sworn and severally deposed that they were
well acquainted with the testator's hand writing and verily believed the said
writing and the same trusts subscribed to be wholly written by the testator

At a Court held for King & Surren County at the Courthouse on Thursday the 3rd day of November 1863. This writing purporting to be last will and Testament of John L. Hibble deceased was offered for probate by Joshua L. Danforth one of the executors therein named and there being no subscribing witnesses to the same Robert B. Ray and Ira B. Cantham were sworn and solemnly depose that they were well acquainted with the testator and verily believed the said writing and the same to be wholly written by the testator's own hand and therefore the said writing is adjudged to be valid as the last will and testament of the said John L. Hibble dec^d
