of estate I may leave after the above legacies. I desire may be equally
divided between all my Children. Should I die indebted to my
wife as her trustee under the will of her mother the late Mrs. Molly
E Jackson of Baltimore Md. I hereby charge the payment of the amount
so due on any real estate I may leave

At a Court held for Gloucester County at the Court House the 6th day of February 1875. This last Will and Testament of John F.
