In the name of God amen. I William Freeman of the County of Gloucester and State of Virginia being of sound mind and memory, thanks to the Almighty God for the same do make this my last will and Testament in manner and form to wit.

1st It is my will and desire that my Executor hereinafter named pay all my just debts out of such property as he shall think best.

2nd I leave unto my beloved wife Catharine Freeman during her life all of my real Estate with such negroes as she may want for the use of the Farm with household and kitchen furniture and such other goods and chattels and hogs and as much grain and provender as she may want for her comfort and support.

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3rd I give unto my daughters Jane Smith and Mary Davies each a negro girl, the said negroes are to be selected after my wife take out such as she may want and the girl that I shall give my daughter Ellen to them and their heirs forever.

4th I give unto my daughter Ellen a negro girl Mary to her and her heirs forever.

5th I give unto my two sons Benjamin F and William H Freeman all of my real estate after the death of my wife to be equally divided among them, also such of the household and kitchen furniture with the stock that my wife may take I give it to them with the real estate to them and their heirs forever.

6th As I have given unto my son Thomas E. Freeman a negro girl to be sold and the money to be laid out in other property for the benefit of his wife and children.

7th The balance of my property I wish to be equally divided among all my chil-
