I, Johnson Smith, being of sound body and mind, do make this my last will and Testament. 1st I leave to my wife Patsy Smith all my property both real and personal to have and to hold during her natural life. 2nd At the death of my wife I desire all my personal property to be divided equally amongst all my children. 3rd Having during my lifetime advanced to my daughter Rebecca Carter as much as her full share in my real estate would amount to, I do not leave her any portion of said real estate. 4th I leave my real estate to my two sons Andrew and Essex Smith and to my granddaughter Sarah Smith in portions as follows. I leave to my son Andrew two acres of land to my son Essex three and a half acres of land to my granddaughter Sarah Smith my dwelling and its appurtenances and one and three quarters acres contiguous thereto. Executed at Gloucester Co. Virginia Wills 1862-1896 day of June 1876.
