I have five hundred & sixteen dollars at interest one hundred of which, I have lent my son Dr J. R. Page four hundred & sixteen, to my son R. M. Page, which I wish equally divided among my children, that is to say one hundred dollars to each, which I wish them to lay out in any thing they prefer, that can be kept as a memento of my devoted love. The remaining sixteen dollars I wish used for the necessary expenses at that time. I leave my son Dr J. R. Page my Executor to carry out these my wishes into effect.

at the Court house on Monday the 5th day of November 1877
this paper writing purporting to be the last will and testament of Lucy Anne Page deceased was produced in Court for proof and there being no subscribing witness to the same Thos. S. Taliaferro and William B. Taliaferro being sworn severally deposed that they are well acquainted with the handwriting of the testatrix and verily believe that the said will and the signature thereto are wholly written by the testatrix's own hand whereupon the same was ordered to be recorded as the true last will and testament of Lucy Anne Page deceased and is recorded
