I Lucy A Lewis being of sound mind do make this my last will & testa-  
ment. At my death I leave to my son Jno. H. Lewis & my daughter Mary  
Susan Lewis four acres of land, to be equally divided between them. If  
I should survive either of the above named Jno or Susan then it is  
my wish that the other shall have the whole of the said land.  
This land was my maiden property & it now stands in the land  
books of Gloucester County as a part of the land of which the late Wm  
J Lewis my husband died possessed. Witness my signature & seal  
in the County of Gloucester State of Virginia this the 29<sup>th</sup> day of  
September 1877.

At a County Court begun and held for Gloucester  
County at the Courthouse on Monday the 6<sup>th</sup> day of April 1880 this last  
will and testament of Lucy A. Lewis deceased was proved in open Court by  
the oath of Chas. Coattell one of the witnesses thereto subscribed, and Ben-  
jamin M Lewis the other witness being dead, Chas. Coattell being sworn de-  
posed that he is well acquainted with the handwriting of the said Benjamin M Lewis and  
verily <sup>believe</sup> that his signature as a witness to said will is in his own handwriting  
whereupon the said will was ordered to be recorded and is recorded.
