In the name of God Amen. I Lucy Field of the County of Gloucester and State of Virginia do make this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me.

As soon as possible after my death I desire that a division of the property real and personal devised and bequeathed by my late husbands will may be made and in making said division I desire that my Nephew ^{Mrs} S. Field by exchange if necessary do have placed in my half of the negro Joan and her two Children Abraham and William. I loan the said Joan and her said Children to Mrs. Mary Ann Yates for her life. and at her death I give them to Mary Eliza Yates daughter of Mary Ann Yates I loan my negro man George to my nephew Dr. Walker F. Jones for his life and at his death I give him to his Children. The residue of the negroes allotted me from my husbands estate.

I wish divided without any sale of any one of them to effect. Such division into six equal parts one of said six parts I loan to Mrs. A. B. Jones for life and at her death I give it to her children Maria Jones and Mrs. C. Jones

One of said six parts I loan to my nephew Mr. Roy Jones and at his death I give it to his Children. One of said six parts I loan to my nephew Robert B. Jones for his life and at his death I give it to his Children

One of said six parts I loan to my nephew Dr. Walker F. Jones for his life and at his death give it to his Children.

One of said six parts I loan to Charles M. Montague for his life and at his death I give it to his Children by his present wife my niece I desire my executors to collect the money due me from my

To my nephew Robert B. Jones for his life and at his death I give it to his Children

One of said six parts I loan to my nephew De Walter F. Jones for his life and at his death give it to his Children.

One of said six parts I loan to Charles M. Montague for his life and at his death I give it to his Children by his present wife my niece I desire my executors to collect the money due me from my nephew Mrs S. Field and thereout pay all my just debts of the remainder I give to my nephew Mr Roy Jones Two thousand dollars to my nephew Thomas H. Jones one thousand dollars and the residue of said fund if any I give to my nephews

Francis D Jones and John F. Jones equally divided between them I desire my executors to sell all my perishable property & to collect all debts other than the debt above mentioned due me and the proceeds of such and collection I give to Charles M. Montague whom I also direct my Executor to consult professionally in any case of difficulty.

I hereby appoint my nephews Mr Roy Jones and Mrs S. Field executors of this my will May 5th 1853

Codicil

In consequence of the death of my nephew Mr. Rey Jones by this Codicil I direct that the property left him in this will be delivered to my nephew Thomas R. Jones to be held in trust for the use of the children of William Rey Jones and in the event that any of said children are the survivors to take, said trust to continue until the youngest of said children shall attain the age of twenty one years and the income to be applied to their education and maintenance and when the youngest of said children attain the age of twenty one the property to vest in them or him absolutely.
