First I wish all my just debts paid. Secondly I give and bequeath to Mary & Catharine infant daughters of Mrs W. C. Battles my bed and chamber with bed furniture for same. Thirdly — I give and bequeath to Betty Battles infant daughter of Mrs W. C. Battles my set of dresses. Fourthly — I give and bequeath to my sister Nancy Flowers the sum of Thirty dollars. Fifthly — to my friends Mrs S. B. Cary and W. M. Nelson I give and bequeath each the sum Twenty five dollars.

in token of my regard for their uniform kindness and attention to me
 I hereby all the assets of my estate of whatever kind, I give and bequeath to
