

Will of Margaret Hatter.

In the name of God, Amen:

I, Margaret Hatter being infirm in body but of sound and disposing mind and memory do make this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking any and all former wills heretofore made by me at any time.

First: I desire all my just debts to be paid by my executor as soon after my death as possible.

Second: I give and bequeath the sum of Fifty dollars unto sister Isadore Kenny of Norfolk, Virginia, to be paid to her out of any personal property which I may leave at my death.

Third: I give and bequeath unto the Rev. John Doherty of the City of Norfolk, Virginia, the sum of Twenty five dollars. And I beg that the said Rev. John Doherty will offer up Masses for the repose of my soul.

Fourth: All the rest and residue of my property, real and personal, whatsoever the same may be, or wheresoever situate, I give devise and bequeath unto the Hospital of Saint Vincent of Paul an incorporated society in the City of Norfolk, Virginia. In this devise is included the house and lot of land which I own in the County of Gloucester and State of Virginia, and I hereby authorize and direct my executor hereinafter named to sell and dispose of the said house and lot of land for the best price that can be got therefor and to turn over the proceeds of sale, after paying the expenses and a reasonable commission, to the beneficiary above

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Fifth: I hereby appoint John A. Beecher of the City of Norfolk

Virginia, my Executor and I request the Court in which he may qualify to permit him to do so without giving other security than his personal bond.

Clare at the request of the said Margant Walter in her presence, and in the presence of each other, signed their names as witnesses thereto. Whereupon it is ordered that the said Will be recorded. And on the motion of John A. Baecher who took the oath required by law, and entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Five hundred dollars, conditioned according to law, without security, said will directing that none should be required Certificate is granted the said John A. Baecher for obtaining a Probate of said Will in due form. And it is ordered that the said Bond be recorded.
