but considering the uncertainties of this transitory life, do make this my last will and
testament, in manner and form following to wch.

First: It is my will and I do ordain, that all my just debts and funeral expenses heavily
paid, and satisfied, as soon as conveniently can be after my decease.

Item, I give and bequeath unto my daughter, Williamson, Rotherow and to my Grandson
Christopher Freeman my property, thy maintaining and taking care of my wife
Sarah Freeman as long as she lives my widow.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Henry Freeman the sum of one dollar, to
be paid, as soon as conveniently can be after the decease of my wife.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Freeman the sum of one
dollar, to be paid, as soon as conveniently can be after the decease of my wife.
And lastly. I nominate, constitute and appoint my said daughter Williamson
Rotherow and my Grandson Christopher Freeman, to be the executors of this my will
hereby revoking all other wills, legacies, and bequests, by me hitherto made, and
declaring this, and no other, to be my last will and Testament.
