I leave my Granddaughter Martha Boswell Glenn one Bed one under Bed 1 Pr of Blankets 1 Pr new Sheets 1 Pr Pillow Cases 1 quilt the Balico one or the White one which one she chooses the other for dear little Fannie. I also leave my granddaughter Martha B Glenn my new Bureau & 2 Glafs the Rocking Chair or the Sew Sew Chair the other for Fannie Ellen. I also leave Martha B Glenn my new Bedstead & Curtains and one half of all my little effects. I leave my granddaughter Fannie Ellen Glenn one Bed one under bed, one pr Blankets, one pr new Sheets, one pr Pillow Cases the old dressing table and my dressing Glafs that stays up stairs and the other half of my effects. I also leave my granddaughter Fannie Ellen Glenn one hundred dollars for the sole purpose of sending her to school & nothing else. I also wish Mr Fawcett to have the care of it for that purpose. I leave my grandson James Roy Glenn one Bed one under bed one pr new Sheets one pr Blankets one pr Pillow Cases and the Blue Cotton Spread. I leave my grandson Peter White Glenn my dining table and my grandson George Garrison Glenn my tea table. I leave my son Thomas Macken Boswell Roy fifty Acres of Land. I leave my grandson Churchill Boswell Roy fifty Acres of Land. I also leave my grandson Thomas Wormley Roy fifty ^{my} Acres of Land. I leave my grandson Macken Boswell Roy ^{now called Jolly Ross in name} fifty Acres of Land. I leave my son Thomas Macken Boswell Roy my gold watch. As Witness my hand and seal This ninth day of May 1858

At a Court held for the County of Middlesex at the Court house thereof at
Saluda on Wednesday the 22nd day of June 1864. This writing purporting to be
the last will and Testament of Mathew B Roy dec^d was produced in Court
and there being no subscribing witnesses Thos. Richard Mc Glenn Alfred Sealy
Philo J. Maister and John P. Ardenton were sworn and severally deposed that
they are well acquainted with the Testator and writing and truly believe the
said writing and the name Thos. subscribed to be wholly written by the
Testator own hand. Whereupon the said writing is ordered to be recorded as
the true last will and Testament of the said Mathew B Roy
